TALL TALES AND TINY TARADIDDLES

STORIES! We've all got stories to tell, and there are SO MANY good ones about. EVERYONE NEEDS A STORY!

We at Widdershins HQ spent the beginning of Lockdown #1 hand picking and telling 40 of our favourites (see YOUTUBE) and during Lockdown #3 we have developed some of them into mini puppet shows – perfect for class sized bubbles. The stories vary in length and age suitability but they are all told with the humour, zest and eccentricity of our bigger shows. Puppets, silly hats and extremely odd noises abound!

Story sessions last between 25mins (a single short story, very suitable for younger children or quick turnover events) and 50 mins (either a single long story suitable for KS2, or a double bill of stories suitable for all ages). Our day rates for these is £250 and this would be for 2 long stories – or the equivalent in short stories or double bills.

The long stories (roughly 50 mins) are:
The Princess & The Pea (H.C. Anderson)
Granny Dumpling (based on a Japanese tale)
Ug, Bug & Dug (A Stone Age Story)

The short stories (roughly 25 mins) are:
The Many Legged Musicians of Bremen (Brothers Grimm)
The Hare & The Hedgehog (Brothers Grimm)
Old Nanny Nibblebeard (based on African tale)

The Double Bills (roughly 50mins with a 5 min – or longer – gap are: The Hare & The Hedgehog + The Three Wishes (Charles Perrault) Old Nanny Nibblebeard + The Wolf & The Seven Young Kids (Brothers Grimm)

We can adapt the "menu" for big or small schools but the ideal audience size would be no bigger than two classes (max 60 children). For Schools with a limited budget and/or allotted time we can do a half day for £150 but only if local (roughly 20 miles radius from Potton).

The Hare & The Hedgehog (Brothers Grimm): In the game of Top Trumps, the Hare would always beat the Hedgehog in Speed, Agility and Length of leg, but in Cunning, the cute little Hedgehog will always win! See how Mr Hedgehog (with the help from Mrs Hedgehog) outwits the stuck up Haversham Hare who believes himself to be the Lord of the Manor.

Schools & Libraries (NOT FESTIVALS): This tale can be part of a double bill. The 2^{nd} story is The Three Wishes (Charles Perrault)



The Princess & The Pea (Hans Christian Anderson):

Is she or isn't she a real princess....?mmm! I wonder.

"Pile up the mattresses, nice and high, Tell her it's for comfort if she asks why. If she says it's bumpy, a Princess she must be. For only a Princess would notice a pea! But if she sleeps as snug as a bug in a rug She cannot be a Princess, she can only be a THUG!"

Granny Dumpling (Based on a Japanese Folk Tale): Granny Dumpling makes the best dumplings in Japan. She is also fearless. When a fresh batch of dumplings rolls away from her house she must follow - even if this means following a hairy little goblin (an Oni) into his underground lair.

Ug, Bug and Dug (a STONE AGE story): A long, long time ago – a time when people lived in caves and had to keep the fire burning to stay alive – there lived three brothers: Ug, Bug & Dug. But what actually happens when the fire goes out and you don't know how to relight it? This is the exciting adventure of the long forgotten Oogadugga Tribe; their quest for fire; and the strange prehistoric beasts they encounter





Old Nanny Nibblebeard (based on an African Folktale Lions are tough and scary! Jackals are cunning and hungry! But the old goat Nanooshka manages to outwit both of them by pretending to be The Queen of All Goats. A Queen with an endless appetite.

Schools & Libraries (NOT FESTIVALS): This tale can be part of a double bill. The 2^{nd} story is The Wolf & The Seven Kids (Brothers Grimm)

The Many Legged Musicians of Bremen (Brothers Grimm): Have you ever wanted to be in a band? Looking cool with a guitar slung over your shoulder? Twiddling drumsticks high in the air? Well, this was the dream of four friends: Rodney the Donkey, Rufus the Dog, Mimi the Cat and Spockerel the Cockerel. The only problem they had was.... they couldn't play their instruments at all!! Prepare your ears for the cacophony.
